Purpose

Mission: To improve health care quality, protect the public, and reduce health care fraud and abuse in the United States.

The Health Resources Services Administration (HRSA) reviews the completeness and accuracy of reports that state licensing and certification agencies (state licensing boards) submit to the National Practitioner Data Bank (NPDB). We gather adverse action data related to the actions taken by state licensing boards and compare it with the actions submitted by the boards to the NPDB.





Software Updates Affecting State Licensure Reports





Certified Self-Query Response


- Self-Query responses are now digitally certified.
- Certified PDFs viewed with Adobe Acrobat Reader display a certification that the file has not been altered.
- Most responses are available immediately.
- Certified files can be added to other documents submitted with licensure applications.

NPDB encourages state licensing boards to directly query on practitioners as needed





Certified Self-Query Response



- Open the file using the latest free version of Adobe Reader.
- Adobe will show the certification information and display an error message if any content has been altered.
- Printed copies of Self-Query responses will not display this certification.



Certified Self-Query Response

Benefits:

- Receive responses in minutes
- Eliminates excess paper
- Maintains authenticity


The NPDB encourages all state licensing boards to accept digitally certified Self-Query responses for faster, more secure, and eco-friendly operations.






Changes to Your Professions List


1. Professions When a user enters the practitioner's license information on a state licensure report, they must select one of your organization's regulated professions for the field of licensure. Review and update your organization's regulated professions, then Continue. If you issue different licenses or certifications for a single profession, you can add a description, such as "intern" or "applicant." Optional descriptions are not allowed for physicians or dentists because you select a specialty for those professions as you submit reports. Profession Name Description





Regulated Professions - Clean Up Effort

Phase 1 – Boards will notice a pared-down professions list containing only the professions they regulate. Administrators received a notification describing the regulated professions changes at the end of June.

Phase 2 – Beginning this October:

- Boards with duplicate professions or simple corrections that can be made automatically will receive a secure message from NPDB
- The Customer Service Center will begin calling boards that need one-to-one assistance to clean up their professions list





NPDB Code List

The NPDB Code List has been updated (Version 2.08 effective June 24, 2021)

Refer to the full <u>Code List</u> for all of the updates

- Updated the description for Adverse Action Classification Code 1179, see Tables 16 and 17
- Updated the descriptions for AAR Basis for Action Codes H2, H3, H4, H5, H6, see Tables 44, 55, 64, 73, 82, 95, 103, 111
- 1179: Limitation or Restriction on Ability to Prescribe, Dispense, or Administer Medication or Sedation, Specify,
- Table 55 Improper Prescribing, Dispensing, Administering Medication/Drug Violation

Code	Description
Н6	Inappropriate Acquisition or Diversion of Controlled Substance
H5	Error in Prescribing, Dispensing or Administering Medication or Sedation

Compliance Review

What is a Compliance Review?

- The NPDB looks at the adverse actions administered by State Licensing Boards in the U.S. and U.S. Territories for the 24-month period preceding each board's NPDB registration renewal date.
- Board data is compared with reports submitted to the NPDB and we identify potential reporting gaps.






